INTRODUCTION:

SMIIC

The Standards and Metrology Institute for Islamic Countries (SMIIC) is an intergovernmental standardization organization affiliated with the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). SMIIC, as a sound mechanism for harmonization of standards among the OIC Countries and for the preparation of new ones, aims at realizing common standards, achieving uniformity in metrology, laboratory testing and establishing accreditation schemes for the purpose of expediting exchange of materials, manufactured goods and products in the Muslim World under the umbrella of the OIC.

Standards are key tools for people to reach products with minimum cost but with quality. Harmonisation of standards, metrology and accreditation is vital for accelerating the development of Muslim country economies. Its use will promote common understanding throughout all member states. A common standards, metrology and accreditation framework eliminates trade barriers and facilitates trade between the OIC member states and the entire world. In an age of globalisation and economic interdependence Islamic countries need to work together to establish fully functional and sustainable knowledge-based economies. This is why The Standards and Metrology Institute for Islamic Countries (SMIIC) is mandated by OIC to act as a professional entity in studying standardization, metrology and accreditation fields and developing standards which will display the interests of Islamic World.

CIDC

Le Centre Islamique pour le Développement du Commerce (CIDC), établi à Casablanca depuis 1984, est l'organe subsidiaire de l'OCI Chargé de promouvoir le commerce et les investissements dans les Pays de l'OCI. Avec plus de 38 ans d'expériences au service des opérateurs public et privé des Etats Membres de l'OCI, le CIDC œuvre à encourager des échanges commerciaux réguliers au sein de la Région OCI, promouvoir les investissements susceptibles de développer des flux commerciaux, contribuer au renforcement des capacités des secteurs public et privés dans les domaines liés au commerce et à l'investissement et assister les États membres dans le domaine de la promotion et des négociations commerciales.

Le développement du secteur Halal est au cœur des activités du CIDC par l'organisation d'un programme de renforcement des capacités sur la sensibilisation sur la certification Halal, l'organisation d'un salon Halal et des forums et rencontres B2B tous les ans dans un pays de l'OCI ainsi que l'édition d'un rapport annuel sur l'industrie du secteur au profit des secteurs public et privé des Etats Membres.

Le CIDC organise en 2022, la 9^{ème} Edition du Salon OCI Halal à Tunis du 14 au 18 septembre 2022, Halal Bahrein du 6 au 8 octobre 2022 et la 10^{ème} édition du Salon OCI Halal à Istanbul du 24 au 27 novembre 2022.

Halal

Over the last decade, halal industry has gone global and we all watched and experienced how it occurred. And by witnessing its expansion, we became more accountable for our roles and tasks as the actors of the halal industry. With this regards, SMIIC, as the unity of 46 countries, approaches to halal in line with its new vision which is "Creating a quality infrastructure that improves economy, welfare and protects our Member States".

This vision also points that halal is part of quality infrastructure. The standards are not fiqh documents, but include Islamic Rules and within SMIIC, halal is perceived as a technical issue thereof, halal standards are developed within SMIIC Technical Committees where various standard projects on halal are studied by both technical and Islamic experts from 46 Member States and liaison organisation such as International Islamic Fiqh Academy.

Capacity Building Trainings

In line with SMIIIC Strategy Plan 2021-2030, SMIIIC coordinates and organizes projects, meetings and trainings for Technical Capacity Building for its members. Within this strategic objective, SMIIIC itself or in cooperation with other OIC Institutions has organized capacity building trainings since its establishment.

ORGANISATEURS:

In frame of 17 Trade Fair of OIC Member States which will be held on 13-19 June 2022, in Dakar, SENEGAL, OIC/SMIIIC Halal Foundation Training for Africa Region on "OIC/SMIIIC 1:2019 General Requirements for Halal Food" will be organized by SMIIIC and ICDT on 15-16 June 2022 au Centre International du Commerce Extérieur du Sénégal (CICES).

OBJECTIFS:

The objective of this training program is to encourage the harmonization of Halal Standards used in the OIC and internationally by aiding in the adoption and use of the OIC/SMIIIC Halal Standards. The program aims to inform the trainees regarding the procedures for adoption, implementation and use of the "OIC/SMIIIC 1:2019 - General Requirements for Halal Food" whilst providing foundation training in Technical Committee (TC) work and auditing.

EXPECTED OUTPUTS:

The expected outputs are:

- The trainees will be trained in:
 - The adoption, implementation and use of OIC/SMIIIC 1:2019
 - Introduction to SMIIIC Information System, TC Work and preparation of standards
 - Introduction to OIC/SMIIIC 2:2019 – Conformity Assessment – Requirements for Bodies Providing Halal Certification
- The number of OIC Member States who have adopted and/or are using the OIC/SMIIIC Standards on Halal have increased which will in turn may facilitate intra-OIC trade.

NOTES

Due to the content of the training, it is recommended that the trainees would have the technical background in the fields of Food, Chemistry, Chemical engineering, Veterinary Science and Biology or similar fields.
